It's a center for creative vitality, uplifting our region's economic health, alongside its soul.





A DESTINATION 60 YEARS IN THE MAKING

Fort Wayne stands out in the nation as a pioneer for creative placemaking. In 1963, Arts United leaders embarked on an ambitious plan to revitalize Downtown Fort Wayne by building a multi-venue cultural district modeled after Lincoln Center in New York City—and they hired world-renowned architect Louis I. Kahn to do it.

Of the original 10-building vision, only one was realized the Arts United Center. Arts Campus Fort Wayne has grown to include seven buildings, a public park and an outdoor market.

THE ROLE OF ARTS UNITED

Arts Campus Fort Wayne is convened by Arts United of Greater Fort Wayne, Inc., bringing collective focus and support to the creative sector of Northeast Indiana. Founded in 1955, Arts United is the third oldest united arts fund in the nation and the region's only local arts agency and regional arts council.

Arts United is a private, nonprofit organization that serves Northeast Indiana through arts advocacy and promotion, fundraising and grantmaking, back-office business support, community and economic development and Arts Campus Fort Wayne coordination. Last year, more than 80 arts and culture nonprofits and initiatives were strengthened by the organization's support.
